This was not the first time that William Commanda and Paul Dewar met. They actually met in April, 2008, with the Community Coalition Against Mining Uranium, at the CITIZENS' INQUIRY INTO THE IMPACTS OF THE URANIUM CYCLE, that former City of Ottawa Mayor Marian Dewar conducted with Fraser McVey. Elder Commanda, an activist on this file from 2007, was invited to offer the opening prayer; and I recall that he was very

impressed with the young man's formal and passionate presentation before his mother at the inquiry; William Commanda noted this because as a historian and politician himself, and the Supreme Chief of the North American Indian Nations Government, he had a passionate interest in politics in the capital city and in global issues and was mindful also of the work and legacy of Paul Dewar's mother.

Dewar responsibility for the initiative (Tribute to Jack Layton Final .pdf) Already then a conscientious and responsible politician, also engaged in the discussion of the exploding global issues that Elder Commanda also worried about daily, he saw the potential of the Elder's Legacy Vision of Hope for positive social and environmental impact on global thinking and Paul Dewar developed his own strategy of action, encouraged as well by several members of his constituency, and he invited Elder Commanda and Douglas Cardinal (the Indigenous Architect who developed the conceptual designs for the Indigenous Centre), to a strategic planning meeting in late winter. Let's exemplify how to save our biosphere, right here, with the protection of our beloved Ottawa River and Gatineau Park.
