Somewhat tongue in cheek, we decided that this would be the year to commence <u>CAN TEACH</u> - that is, the Circle of All Nations (CAN) project of Training, Education, Advocacy, <u>Communications and Healing (TEACH)</u>. It ended up being a years with significant outreach and further advancement of Grandfather Commanda's priorities. We held four formal events, and participated in several others; we miss our Gatherings on the land, but CAN is evolving!

Now, most of our CAN friends know we have in essence been doing the CAN TEACH type of outreach for years; during the past year we focussed more formally, to align with our formal study of Grandfather, Elder, Dr. William Commanda, invested with two honorary doctorate degrees, and Officer of the Order of Canada, to ascertain whether his approach to eco-peace building issues can contribute to academic knowledge.

Formally, we wanted to understand his particular approach and discourse, and we wanted to understand its potential relevance for contemporary times. We also wanted to keep the fire of his passion, guidance and wisdom burning so others would understand why he remains so critically important to his CAN friends all over the place.
