Romola V. Thumbadoo worked in criminal, social and Indigenous justice across Canada as a federal civil servant, in operations, policy and planning (25 years); and, at the grass roots level, with the *Circle of All Nations* global eco peace community founded by late Indigenous Elder William Commanda (25 years). Her Master's thesis examined detribalization and racism in African literature (*Detribalization and Racial Conflict as Major Themes in Peter Abraham's African Writings*); she completed her PhD thesis entitled *Ginawaydaganuc* and the *Circle of All Nations: The Remarkable Environmental Legacy of Elder William Commanda* in 2018, and postdoctoral research on William Commanda's discourse and legacy in 2021, both under the supervision of Professor D. R. Fraser Taylor, Cartographer and Director of the Geomatics and Cartographic Research Centre (GCRC), Geography and Environmental Studies, Carleton University. She supports his work as executive assistant and research associate, is CEO of the *Circle of All Nations*, and is a writer, photographer and artist. She wrote two books about William Commanda, Ojigkwanong (*Learning from a Kindergarten Dropout*, Books One and Two; and a kayak photo journal. She is presently researching children's mapping. https://circleofallnations.ca.

Work and Academic History

My current research in academia is strongly influenced by significant policy and program initiatives within the federal government, extensive *on the ground* work and understudy of the legacy of North American Indigenous political, environmental and spiritual leader, William Commanda. I am also involved in community-based criminal and social justice work and advocacy, sustained by a lifelong passion for literature, arts and humanities.

Mini Backgrounder

I am of East Indian ancestry, was born in South Africa, and have a multiracial family. I have resided in Canada since 1970, earning degrees in English Literature at McMaster University (BA Hons and MA.) and completing my PhD and SSHRC Postdoctoral Fellowship at Carleton

University in Geography; I am now a postdoctoral researcher in Geography, Cartography, Cybercartography and Social Science. I worked extensively in the correctional system and in Indigenous justice with the federal government; and in Indigenous-based grassroots work. I am a writer, photographer and artist.

Government and Criminal Justice System

I worked extensively across the country for the federal government, chiefly within the criminal justice system (in Federal Corrections, in operations, programs, policy and planning; in Indigenous corrections, justice, policing, and restorative justice; in Veterans Affairs and Heritage) for over twenty-five years (1976 – 2002). I participated in the federal Career Assignment Program for senior management development, and in an international Interchange Canada Agreement with Real Justice (family group conferences and restorative practices). Key work assignments I held the lead on are as follows:

<u>Indigenous/Grassroots/William Commanda</u>, *Ojigkwanong/*Morning Star

I have coordinated and managed the Circle of All Nations, founded by late North American Indigenous Elder William Commanda Ojigkwanong/Morning Star (Algonquin Canoe Builder, Wampum Heritage Keeper, Chief, Supreme Chief of the North American Indian Nation, Officer of the Order of Canada, Honorary Doctor of Philosophy and Causa Honorific) since its formalization in 1997, supporting his work to advance Indigenous knowledge, environmental stewardship, racial harmony and peace building through a range of gatherings, conferences, outreach, advocacy work and strategic written communications. Note that the Circle of All Nations is neither an organization nor a network, but rather a global bridge-building eco-peace community linked by his unshakeable conviction that in a very fundamental way, as children of a living Gaia - Mother Earth, we all belong together, irrespective of colour, creed or culture, and that together, we must regain our respect for this penultimate mother. In 2002, I took early retirement and animated this grassroots Circle of All Nations work pro bono during the last 15 years of his life; I also articulated his vision for the Asinabka international Indigenous eco peace centre (https://asinabka.com). I wrote two books on the Circle of All Nations work (Learning from a Kindergarten Dropout Books 1 and 2), and a photo journal on my kayaking explorations of Bitobi Lake, Quebec, as viewed through the lens of his Indigenous wisdom and nature-based healing. After his death in 2011, I returned to academia, to research and record his singular work and legacy, and I am presently writing his biography. I write and create all the micro and macro level teaching,

learning and the cyber-animative materials in the integrated archival and contemporary website https://circleofallnations.ca and consolidate this with my academic research; and I animate the Circle of All Nations work online and elsewhere. The website hosts an extensive library of fully accessible Circle of All Nations research, documents, presentations, audio/visual material and annual reports on the work from 1997, inclusive of three archival sites, the contemporary site and links to online social media outreach. Print books on social media outreach, document the cybernetic work underway since 2009, and provide extensive textual and visual data for investigation, research and analysis and in communications, artificial intelligence and online community development, reflexivity and relationality.

I also honour the Donald Marshall Junior Indigenous justice legacy (note the Marshall Inquiry and the Marshall Decision). I met him in 1996, and I remained his close friend and activist colleague till his passing in 2009; we worked together on Indigenous justice and rights issues, reconciliation and peace building, strategies for Indigenous youth empowerment (in the Department of Justice Aboriginal Justice Learning Network work of the late nineties), and with William Commanda, and *Circle of All Nations* commemorates his legacy each September.

I served as voluntary director of the Wolf Project, dedicated to honouring efforts to promote racial harmony (1998 – 2021 - http://www.wolfproject.com/). I have researched the innovative systemic constellation healing work of Bert Hellinger/Dr. Karl Heinz Rauscher (https://rauscherblog.com/), rooted in Zulu ancestral traditions, and complementary to the principles of *Ginawaydaganuc* interrelatedness. I was personally acquainted with several national and international Indigenous elders since the 90s and with shamanic colleagues of William Commanda; and I learned directly from them as well.

Current Academic Research

William Commanda, Indigenous and Circle of All Nations:

In 2012, I commenced doctoral studies on the William Commanda's work and legacy. In January 2018, I completed my PhD research in Geography and Cybercartography, under the supervision of Dr. D. R. Fraser Taylor, Director of the Geomatics and Cartographic Research Centre (GCRC), Geography and Environmental Studies, Carleton (https://gcrc.carleton.ca); my research examined the Circle of All Nations discourse of late Algonquin Elder William Commanda and my thesis is entitled Ginawaydaganuc and the Circle of All Nations: The Remarkable Environmental Legacy of Elder William Commanda https://curve.carleton.ca/aa4e3cbb-5b83-464d-8286-a901fcd77b06). Thereafter, I completed a two year SSHRC postdoctoral research fellowship on his extensive legacy, including on his continued presence in the online world (2021 October 28.pdf). I remain engaged in further research on his life, work legacy and discourse, particularly in cognitive cartography and photoatlassing. With respect to photoatlassing, examination of the graphic and textual semiotic framework of the William Commanda/ Circle of All Nations communications commenced with Dr. Dr.h.c. Alexander Wolodtschenko (ERASMUS-Dozent der TU Dresden, Co-editor: DKTK, Meta-cartoa series of seven photo-atlases. I have theorized key elements in the Commanda thinking and knowledge generation practice via the lens of cognitive and motional cartography, oral storytelling, syntropy, pentimento spatial and temporal amalgamation, cybernetic animation/steering, social media presence, discourse, semiotic photo-atlassing, canoe iconography, cybercartography and animative grounded theory in a series of postdoctoral papers and presentations.

Other: administration; publications; and children's mapping.

Since November 2017, I have served as Executive Assistant to Professor Fraser Taylor, Director of GCRC at Carleton University, and this has included supporting editorial work in academic publications and his program of research, in particular in Cybercartography, a concept he first articulated in 1997, and thereafter developed at the GCRC in an integrated program of research, technology, partnership, project development, theory and practice, and publication.

In 2021, I initiated an innovative international children's mapping project with the National Association of Child Care Workers (NACCW), South Africa, expanding on the International Cartographic Association's (ICA) Barbara Petchenik Children's Map Competition launched by Professor Taylor in 1997; five presentations on this intersectional work linking social science, social work and humanities was presented at the ICA's international conference in South Africa – ICC 2023; and has led to the creation of a Memorandum of Understanding between Carleton University, Durban University of Technology, NACCW and *Circle of All Nations*. New research will examine cognitive mapping in childcare practice and as therapeutic art, and use of AI mapic games and visualization tools the use; and support the creation of an international children's mapping network. An innovative Youth Mapping Winnipeg heritage/Indigenous mapping project was initiated and completed successfully with Immigrant Partnership Winnipeg in 2023/24.

Undergraduate and graduate students have supported and been mentored in the research activities, and their work is featured in my presentation at the IEEE SSIT 3rd Conference on Norbert Wiener in the 21st Century 2021 and elsewhere.
